Curriculum Development

Italian 2130-Intro to Literary Analysis. Students discuss and write about short stories, plays and excerpts from novels by contemporary authors. Taught in Italian, Requirement for the Italian major/minor

Italian 3030-Art History in Italian. Students study Classical, Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque and Modern art, and learn to express themselves both orally and in writing in a more sophisticated and technical manner. The course provides an opportunity to study Italy's rich artistic traditions while greatly improving language skills. Taught in Italian, Fulfills Major/Minor requirement

Italian 1050-Fast-Track Italian. Two semesters of Italian in one for students who have studied many languages, native speakers of Spanish, and students with previous study of Italian. Developed and proposed in conjunction with Instructor Susanna Saurini. Fulfills MAPS requirement

Study Abroad Curriculum Development

Huen 3700—Culture Wars in Rome. A Global Seminar taught on-site in Rome, Italy which focuses on the history, art and culture of three major periods: Ancient Pagan, Renaissance Christian, and Modern Secular. Approved for the Italian major.

Other courses taught

Italian 1500-That's Amore. A course taught in English on Italian history, literature, art, politics and culture. Fulfills arts and sciences core curriculum: contemporary societies.

Italian 1010-Beginning Italian. A course in which the four skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing are progressively developed in a predominantly oral presentation. Fulfills MAPS

Italian 1020-Beginning Italian. A continuation. Fulfills MAPS

Italian 2110-Second-Year Italian Reading, Grammar and Composition. A course which provides a thorough grammar review and improves reading abilities and writing skills. Fulfills MAPS

Italian 2120-Second-Year Italian Reading, Grammar and Composition. A continuation. Requirement for the Italian major/minor

Faculty Classes, Beginning to Advanced Levels. Courses in which enrollment is limited to faculty and staff at the University of Colorado. Run through ALTEC and the Office of International Education. The courses are smaller, more interactive, and address the difficulties of learning new languages as an adult.

Continuing Ed courses

History of World Art 2. A three-credit course surveying art from 1400 to the present including European, Asian, African and Native American art.

Art Appreciation-Renaissance to the Present. A survey course of Fine Arts spanning the centuries. Responsible for all lectures, slide selection, and initiation of class discussion.
