The goal of this course is to foster a deeper understanding of music, tuning, timbre, and sound through a hands-on experience of Physics concepts in a creative laboratory environment. The course surveys numerous topics through the construction of PVC overtone flutes, scientific method-driven dive into inharmonicity and piano preparations, an investigation in the timbral intention of Dolly Parton's vocal technique, the construction of a "vowel violin," working with physical modeling through the testing of 3D-printed vowel flutes, among other projects. More generally, the course considers the productive tension between qualitative and quantitative understandings of musical concepts through the *scientific method*.
