Kaitlyn Davis is an Assistant Professor of Anthropology at Northern Arizona University, part-time instructor for the University of Colorado's Continuing Education Program, and a Senior Archaeologist for Chronicle Heritage's Rocky Mountain Region Offices, with 10 years of professional archaeology and environmental science experience spanning the United States. Kaitlyn has managed multiple large multi-site projects from start to finish in the American Southwest. Middle and Eastern Woodlands. Rocky Mountain West, and Central Plains. Kaitlyn has directed field crews for several NHPA and NEPA-related projects, totaling thousands of acres throughout the American Southwest, Rocky Mountain West, High Plains, and Central Plains. She has received consistent high remarks from regulatory agencies, such as the Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, Montana Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, New Mexico State Land Office, tribal governments, and private entities. She has experience in cultural resource regulatory compliance and document preparation for the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Sections 106 and 110, National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA).

Kaitlyn has completed intensive inventory of more than 10,000 acres in the Rocky Mountains and High Plains, personally recording over 100 sites dating from the Paleoindian through historic periods. She has extensive experience with multiple stages of cultural resource management, including reconnaissance survey, intensive survey, initial testing, and mitigation/data recovery. Her extensive fieldwork, laboratory, and reporting experience provides a deep understanding of how to successfully complete projects within a variety of settings with a variety of resource types. She also has extensive experience consulting with Native American tribes local to California, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, and Montana.

Kaitlyn has specialized experience in the Four Corners Region, Intermountain West, and government archaeology. As a field archaeologist for Crow Canyon Archaeological Center, she completed several months of survey, excavation, and analysis in Montezuma County. As a crew chief for PaleoCultural Research Group, she supervised crews completing survey, test excavations, and rock art recording in the Rio Grande Natural Area on the Colorado-New Mexico border. inter-site visibility analysis of Pueblo I through Pueblo III settlements in the Mesa Verde Region, and helped facilitate tribal and agency consultation regarding the Greater Chaco Landscape. Her MA and PhD research involved field and laboratory work in northern New Mexico, and her field school was in Northeast Arizona. As a Forest Service employee on the Lolo National Forest in Montana, she trained archaeological technicians in GIS and supervised several NEPA-related cultural resource inventory surveys in advance of timber sales. She received a merit award from the Lolo National Forest at the completion of the 2021 field season. Throughout all of these projects, she trained and supervised, while consulting with several stakeholders including agencies, tribes, and private landowners.

Kaitlyn's technical and analytical expertise include ceramic analysis (particularly Northern San Juan and Northern Rio Grande ceramics), microbotanical analyses, and geospatial methods. She also has been the first author on multiple peer-reviewed publications and national presentations and was a co-Pl on a National Science Foundation grant.
