II. Academic Program Development – University of Colorado at Boulder

- **Certificate and MA in Applied Shakespeare**
Worked with faculty in THDN, ENGL, and the Colorado Shakespeare Festival to create a professional masters certificate (which started in 2017). We have hired a new director and are revamping the program to begin anew in 2020.
- **MFA in Experience Design**
Worked with Professor Bruce Bergner to create a new professional masters program, which was approved by the Regents in 2016 and admitted our first cohort in fall 2018.
- **Exchange Program with University of East London**
Began work in 2008 to create an undergraduate student exchange program with the UEL Theatre Studies program; approved by CU Boulder in fall 2010. Program ran 2012-17.
- **Theatre MA / MBA joint degree**
Intended for students interested in careers in arts administration, this degree program contains course work in a non-thesis track MA in Theatre and an MBA which internships in regional professional arts organizations. Program approved 2005.
- **Certificate Program in Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Studies**
I was a member of the committee which created the Certificate Program in LGBT Studies; the program was approved in 1997. We graduated our first "class" May 1999 with five students. III. Course Development – CU Department of Theatre & Dance

- **THTR 5051 – Contemporary Theatre**
Created a new course for graduate students which explores contemporary world drama and theatre (1950s to the present), spring 2011.
- **THTR 4039 / THTR 5039 – Musical Theatre Repertory**
This is a performance class in which students learn and perform group numbers from the musical theatre canon. The music and lyrics are written down, but the original choreography is often not recorded, or recorded in a form which the students cannot read (Labanotation), and is often too technically difficult for the students to master. Therefore, half of the "text" of the course is my choreography, created in the styles of seminal choreographers of the 20th century.
- **THTR 3009 / 3011 – Development of American Musical Theatre**

When I took over this course Fall 1997, I created a new course packet with extensive biographical information on the various artists covered in the course and worksheets for the musicals which the students are required to study and analyze. I added a web component (WebCT) to the course Spring 2006 and streaming video in 2007. Prior to 1997, the course was taught once a year, in 2012-13 there are nine sections serving approximately 900 students.
