Shawhin Roudbari is an associate professor in Environmental Design (ENVD) at the University of Colorado Boulder. In his research, Shawhin studies ways designers organize to address contentious social problems such as racism and human rights violations. In addition to engaging transnational institutions, Shawhin bridges sociological studies of social movements and race with architectural theory. He is a founding member of the Dissent by Design Collective, which uses design and theory building to investigate ways dissent and anti-racism are articulated through architectural scales of space. He currently serves as co-director of the Center for Community Engagement, Design, and Research (CEDaR) and is a founding executive committee member of the Center for Creative Climate Communication and Behavior Change (C3BC).
